## **MetroForum** Breakfast to Discuss Miami-Dade Special Election for "Strong Mayor"

Miami (January 10, 2007)- Miami Dade County Mayor Carlos Alvarez and Metropolitan Center Director Dr. Dario Moreno will be the headline speakers at a breakfast entitled "The Aftermath of the Strong Mayor Vote: What Happens Now?" The panel will discuss the future direction of county government following the results of the January 23, 2006 special election to decide if the structure of the County government should be changed.

"The Metropolitan Center was created to serve as high and neutral ground for issues of public controversy. We are pleased to host a discussion on how the strong mayor debate has reenergized Miami-Dade politics," said Dr. Dario Moreno, Director of the Metropolitan Center.

The Metropolitan Center expects to release new results on January 15, 2007 based on a current poll Dr. Moreno is conducting assessing the attitudes of Miami-Dade County residents toward expanding the Alvarez's mayoral responsibilities.
