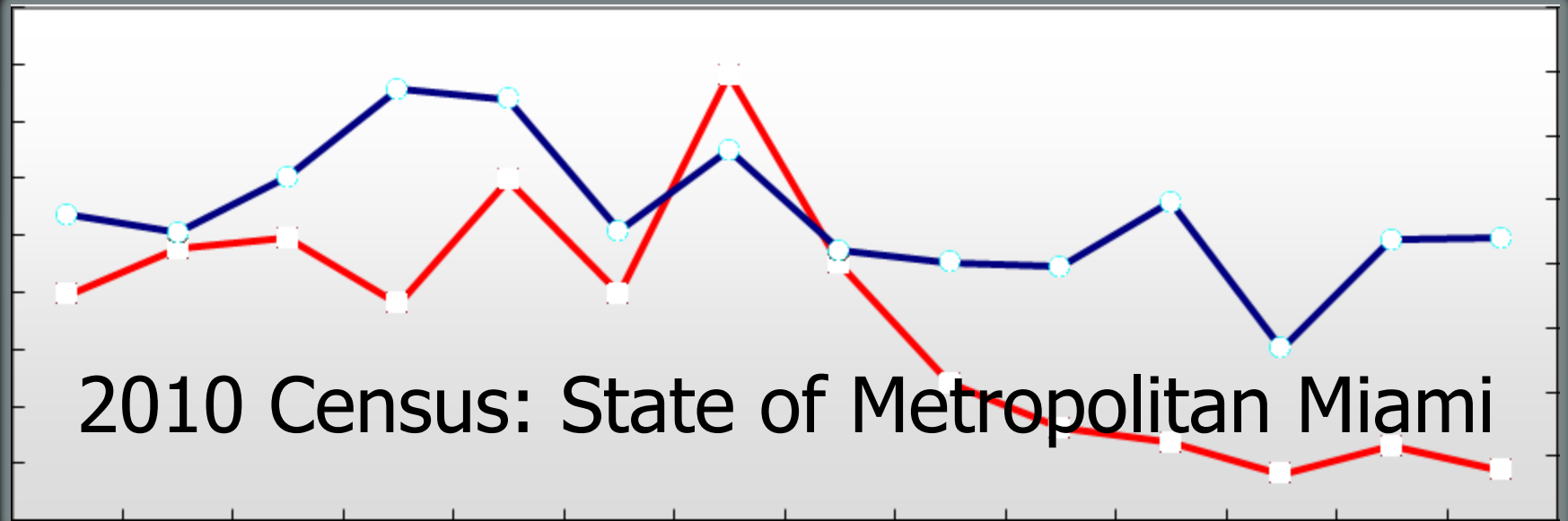
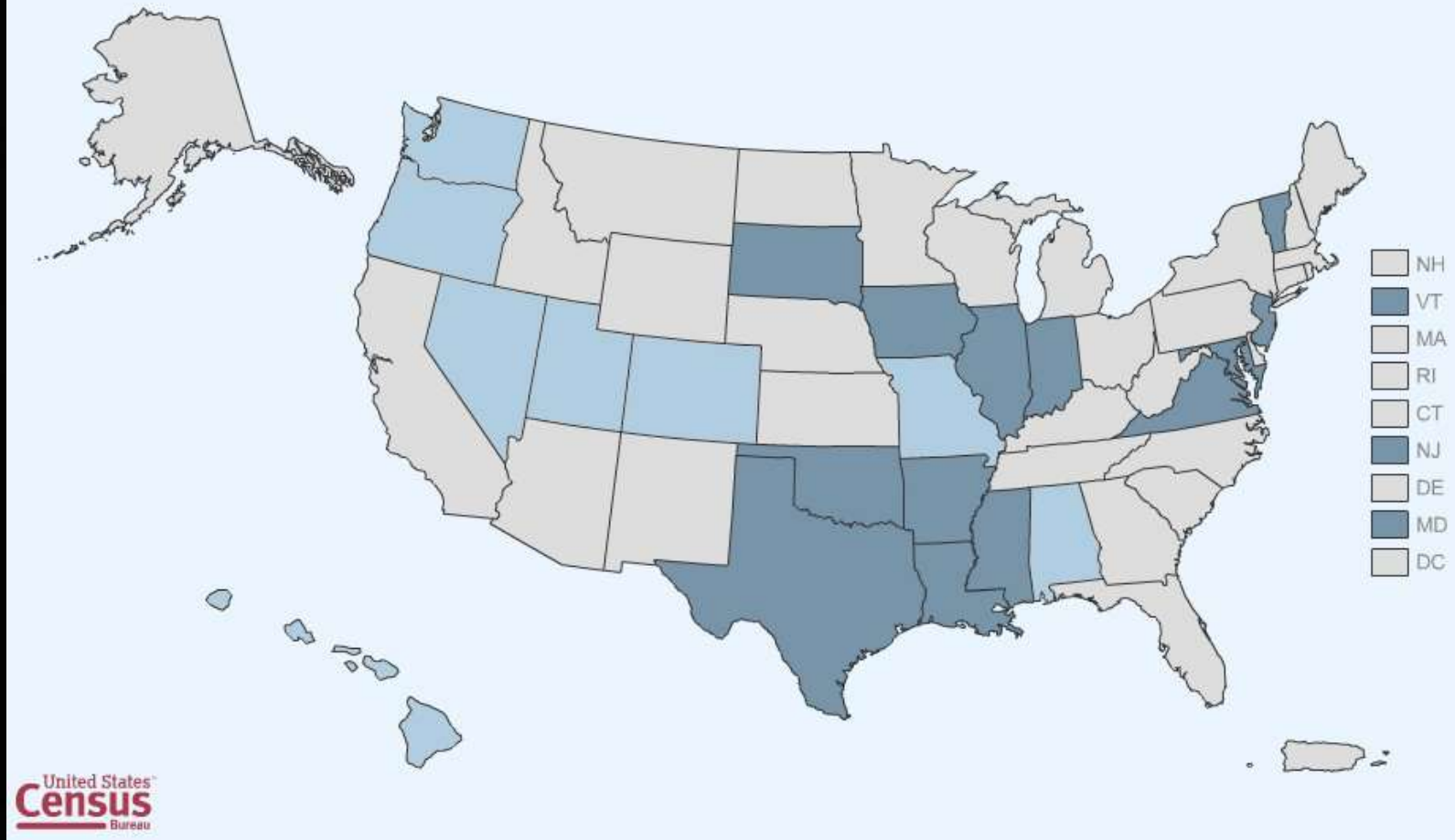

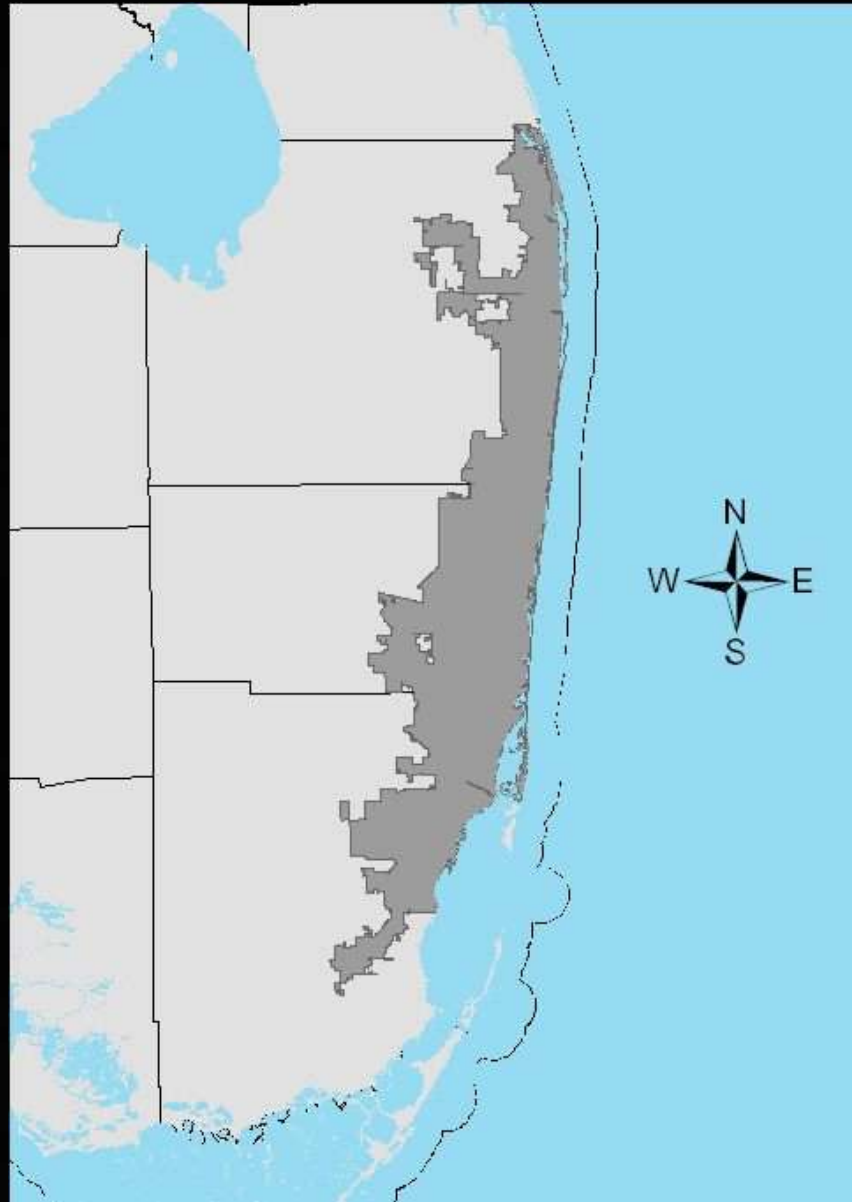


City Comparisons

- Diversity, Educational, Aging, Income Inequities
- Comparison of like Urbanized Areas - densely settled areas consisting of core census block groups or blocks that have a population density of at least 1,000 persons per square mile and surrounding census blocks that have an overall density of at least 500 persons per square mile

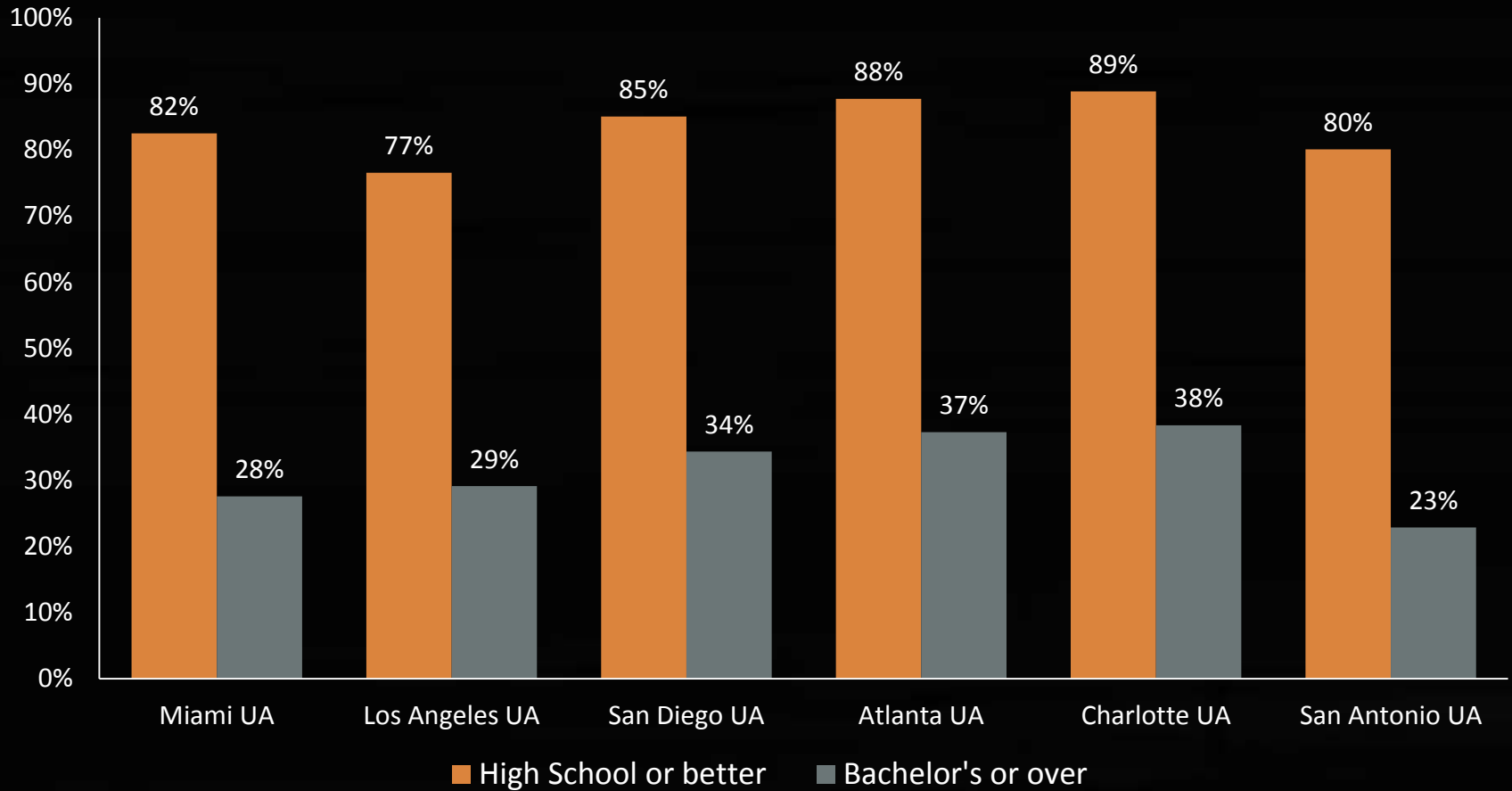
Miami Urbanized Area; Tri-County



A more educated populace

- Miami's school system has succeeded in lifting the education levels of all groups, especially Blacks & Hispanics.
- Better than several similar cities in educating Hispanic students
- Falls behind in educating Black students.

Educational Attainment, 2009

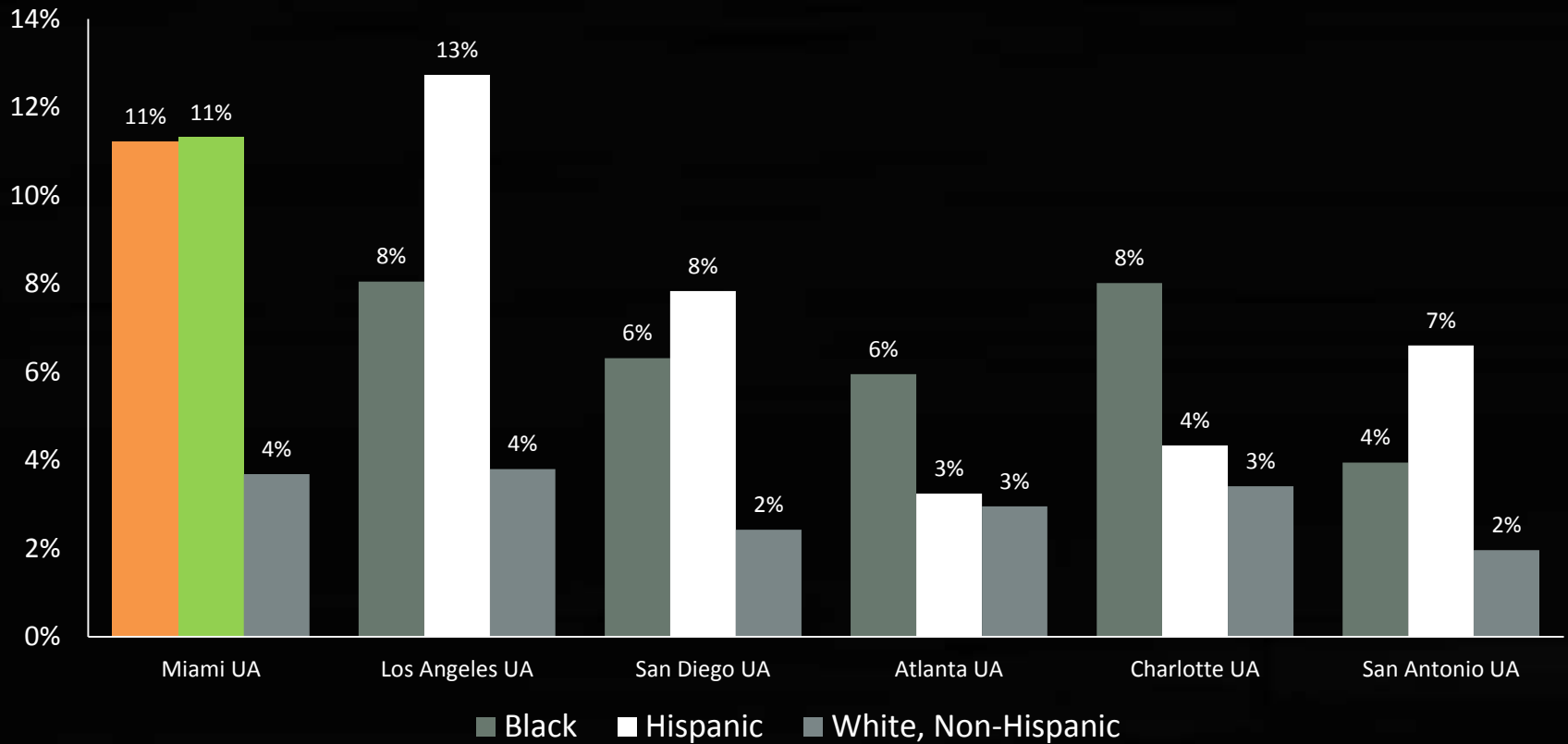


Differences by Ethnic Group

- A comparison of Miami to other Urbanized Areas shows Miami Hispanics are generally better educated with a significant increase in college graduation.
- A comparison of Miami to other Urbanized Areas shows Blacks in Miami are generally less educated and graduate college less often.
- The percentage of Miami Black and Hispanic populations with a High School diploma or greater increased by 11 percent since 2000.

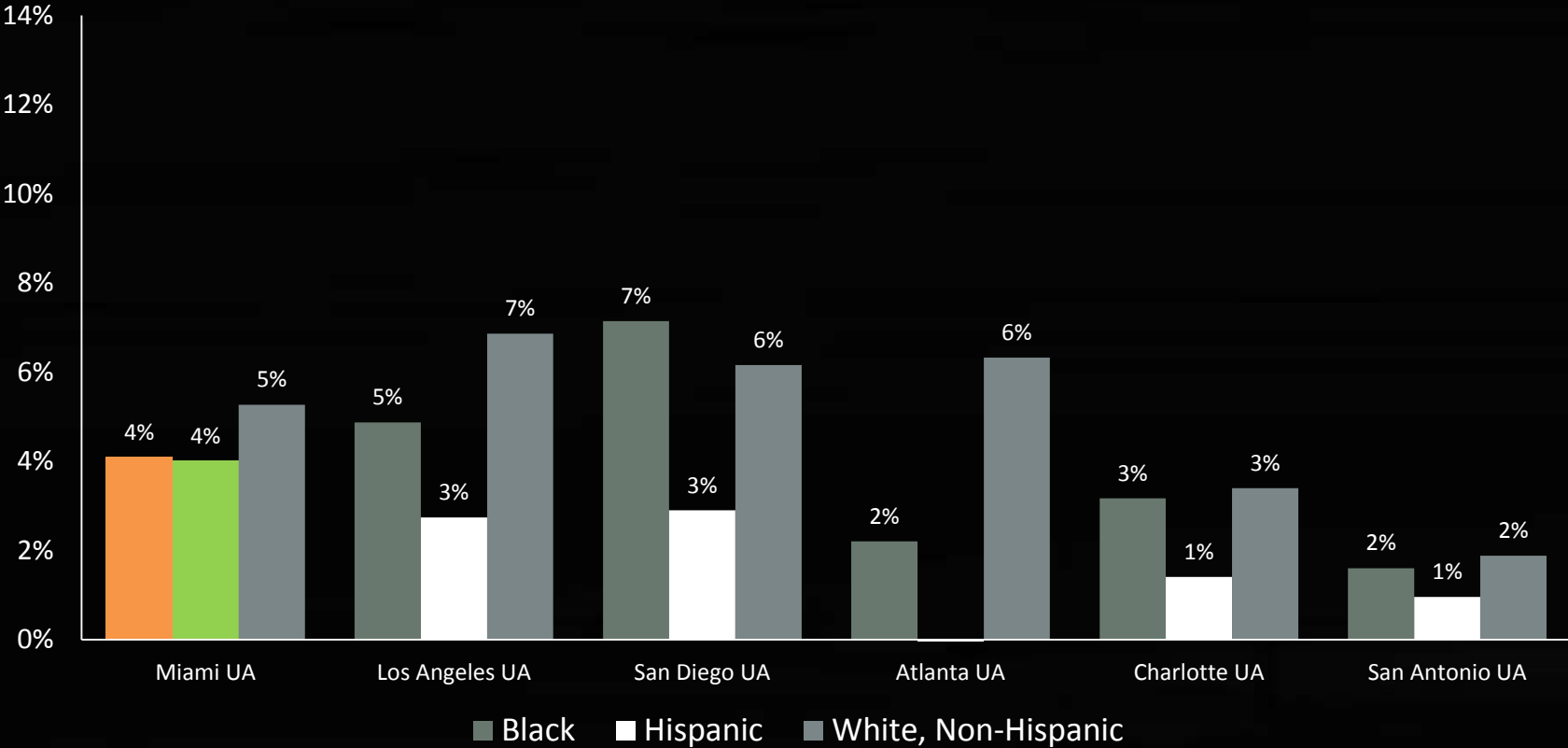
Educational Gains: High School Diploma and Over

Income and Poverty

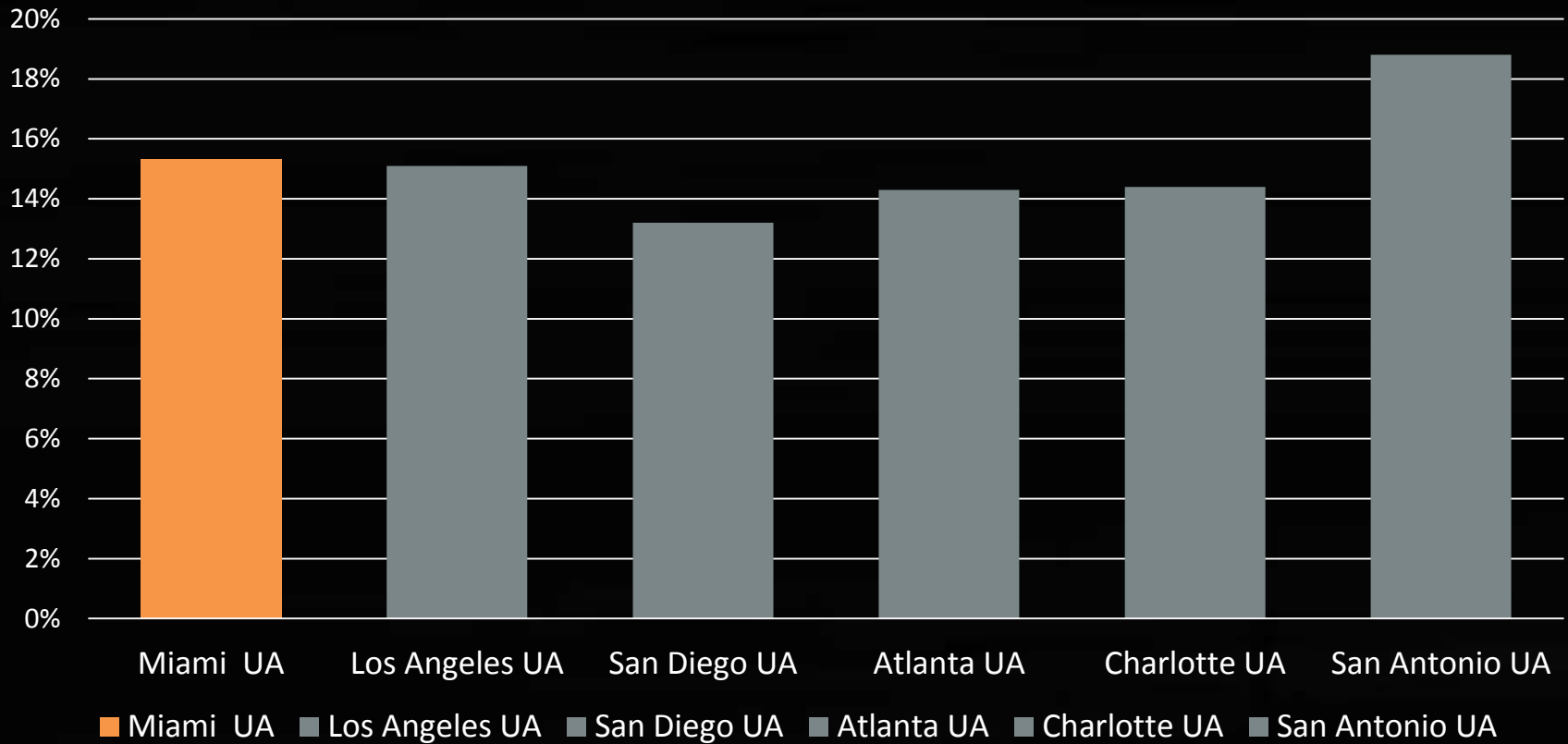
- Miami is poorer than Los Angeles, San Diego, Atlanta and, Charlotte.
- Using a constant 2009 dollar, the median earnings of men and women have consistently trended downward in all cities compared here except Atlanta, which had begun to recover.

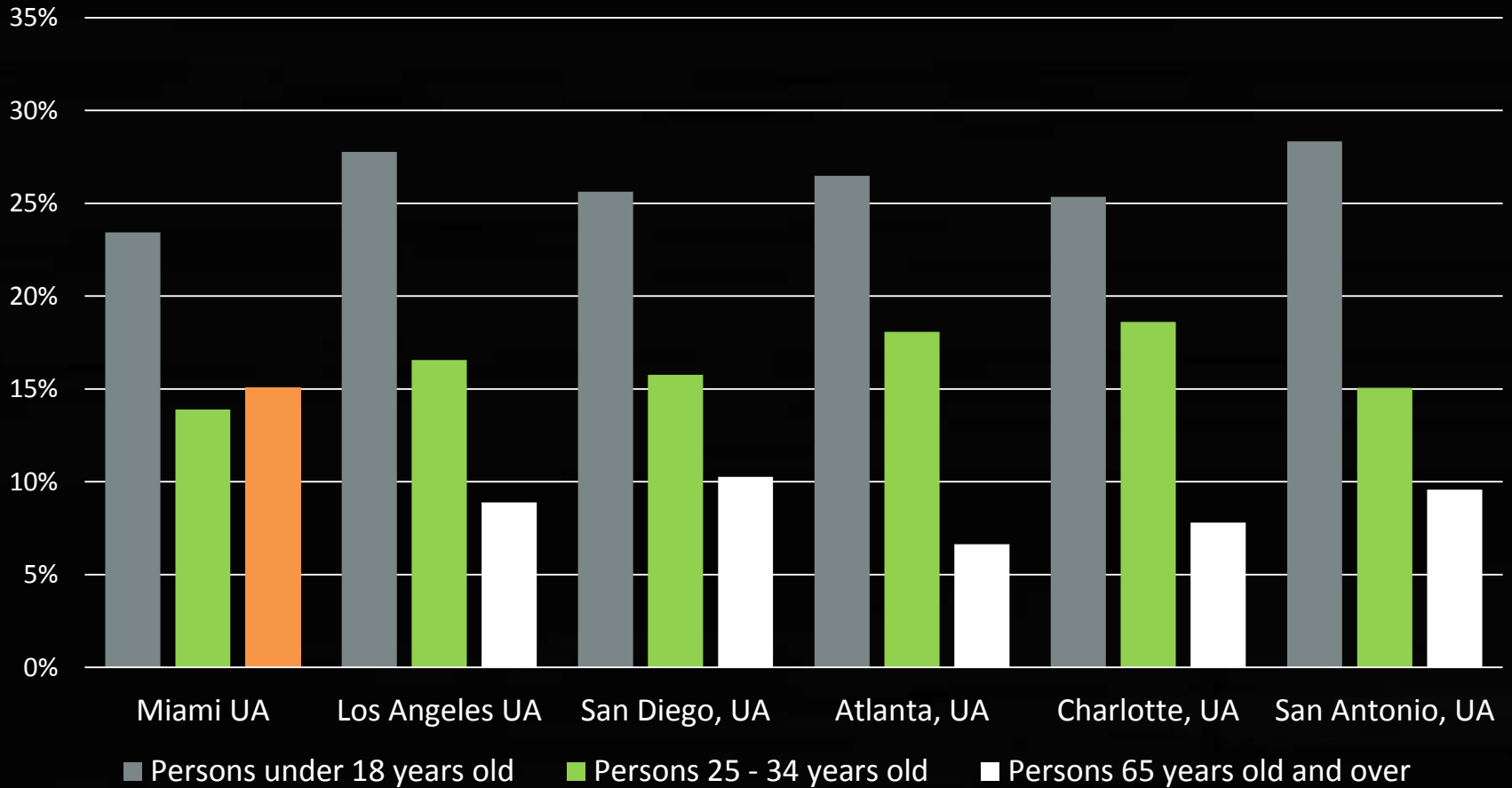

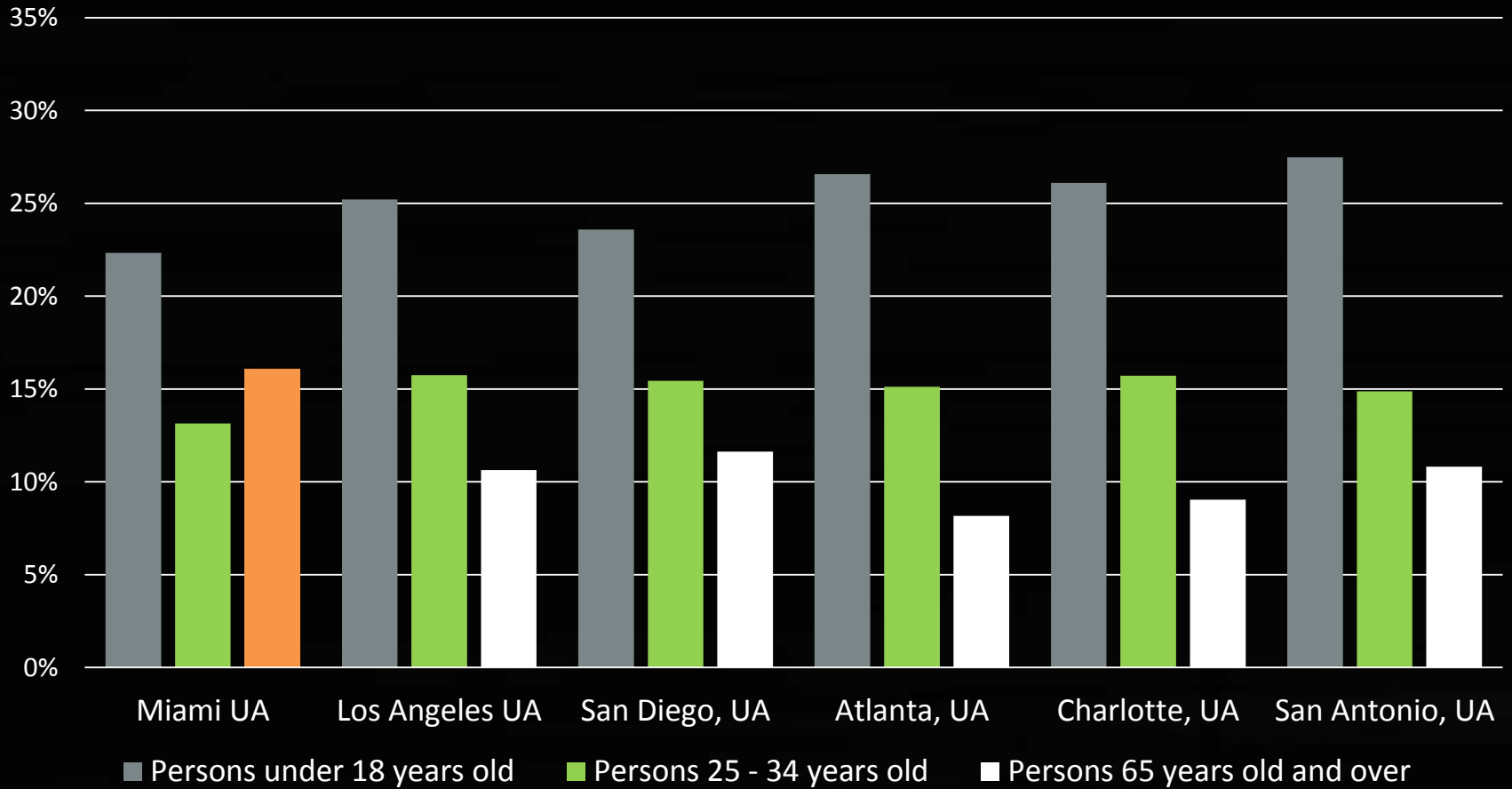
Attracting Older and Young Professional Populations

- Miami has a growing population of young professionals aged 25-34.

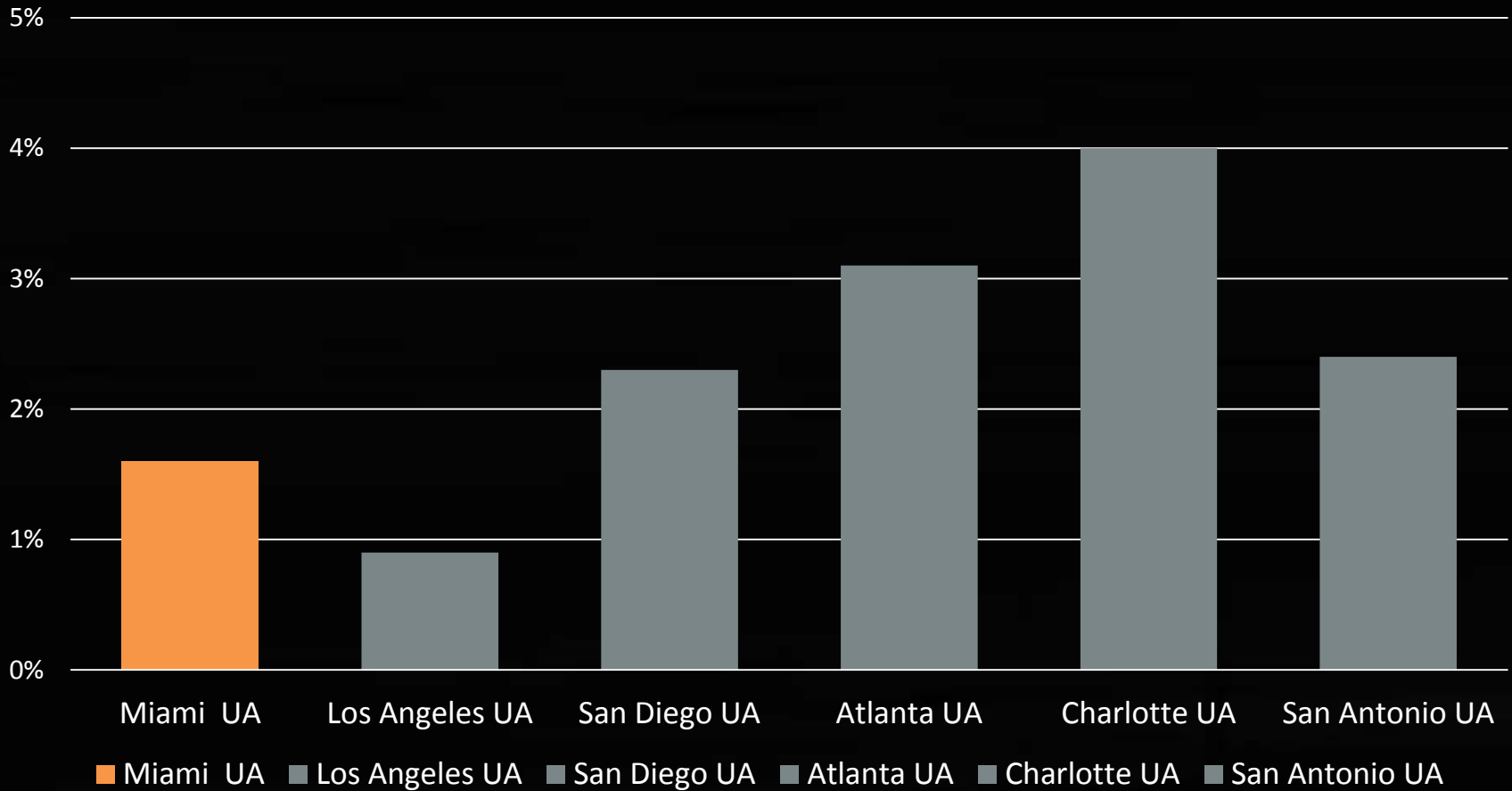
Age Groups in 2000



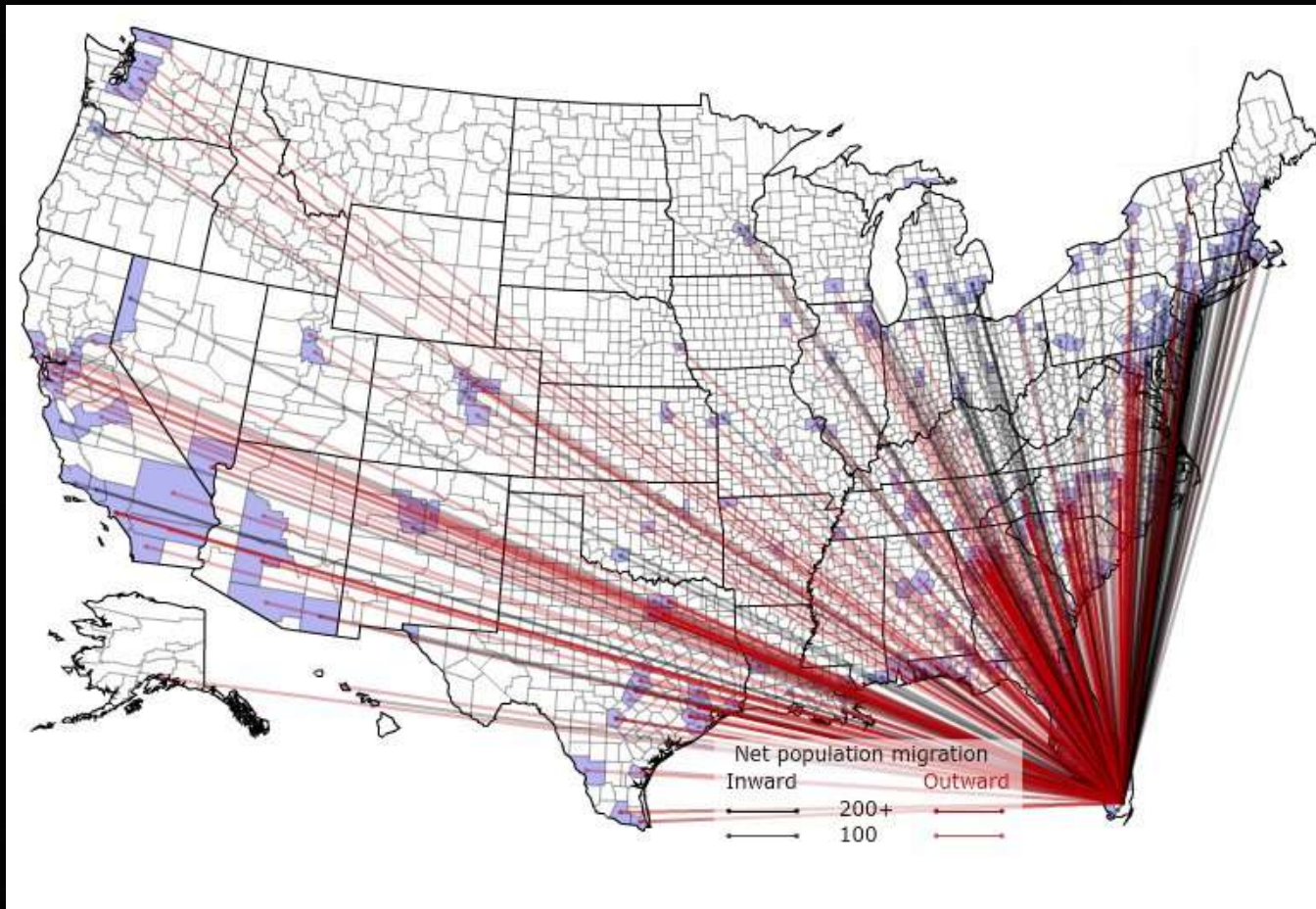
Age Groups in 2009
