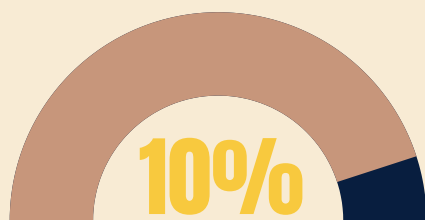
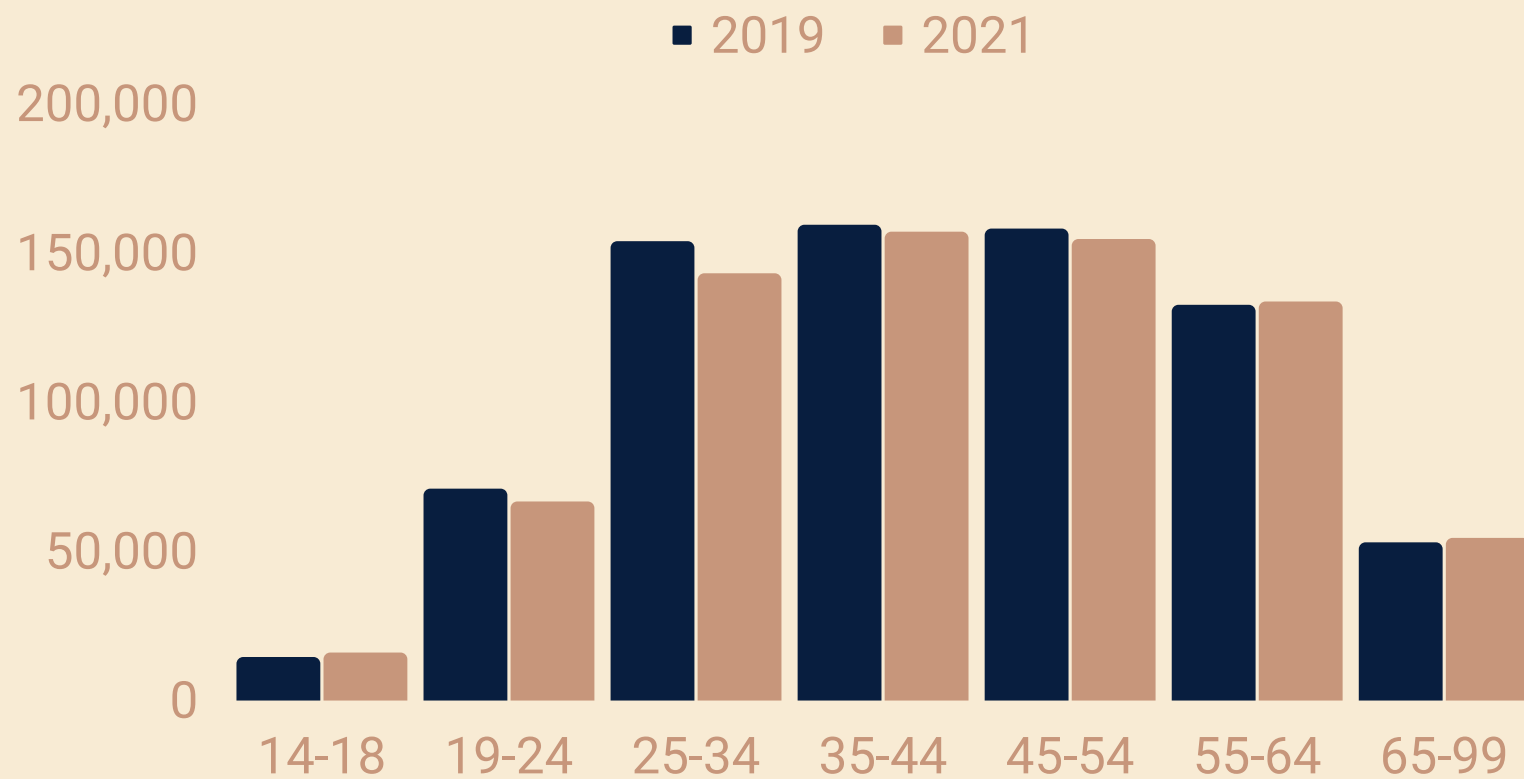

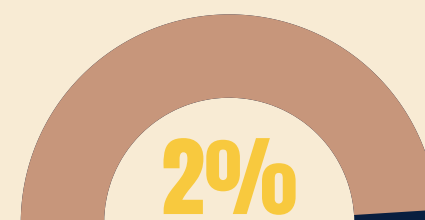
Employment Count

BROWARD

The employment count in 2019 compared to 2021 demonstrates that Broward County has not fully recovered from the pandemic in terms of employment, but they are improving. Between sex, age, race, and ethnicity the employment count has decreased since 2019.



Employment count has **increased** 10% for 14-18 year olds in Broward, a group typically underrepresented in the workforce.

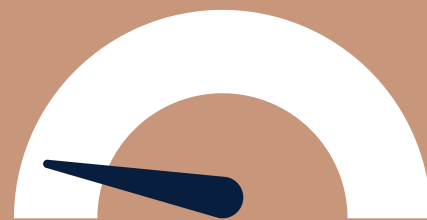
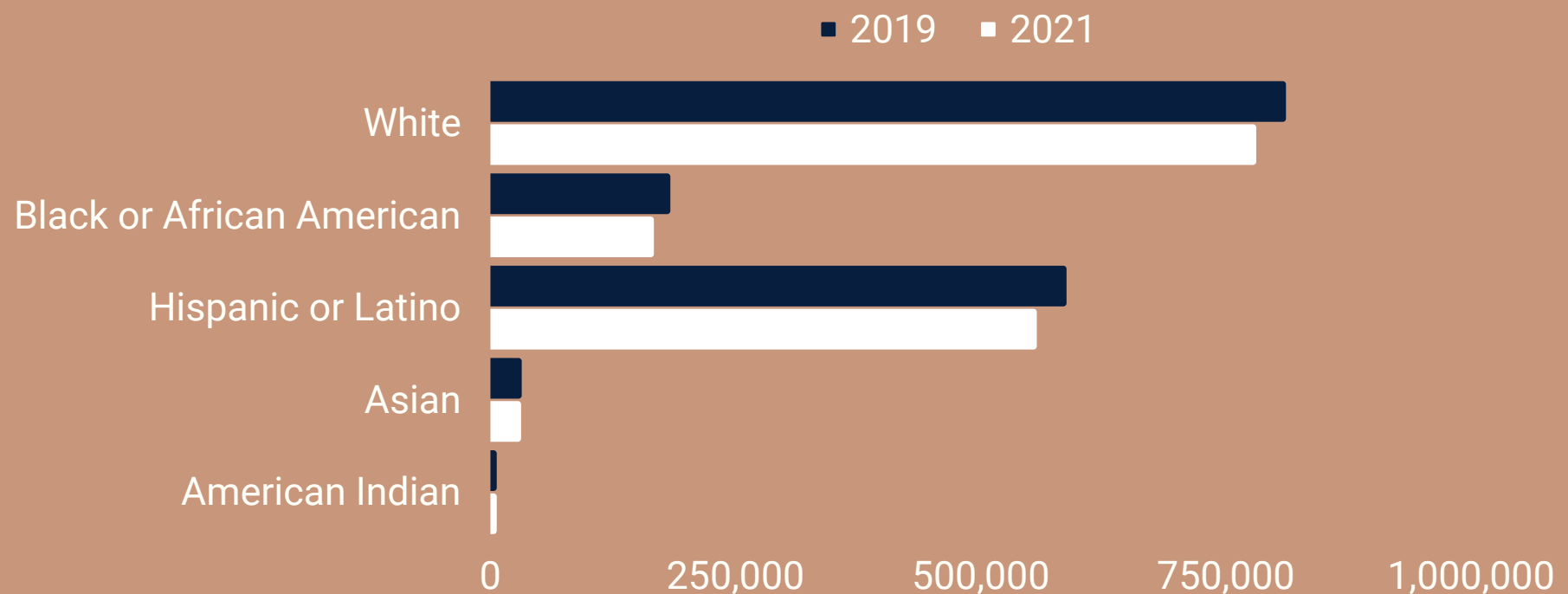


Employment count has **increased** 2% for 65-99 year olds in Broward, a group typically underrepresented in the workforce.

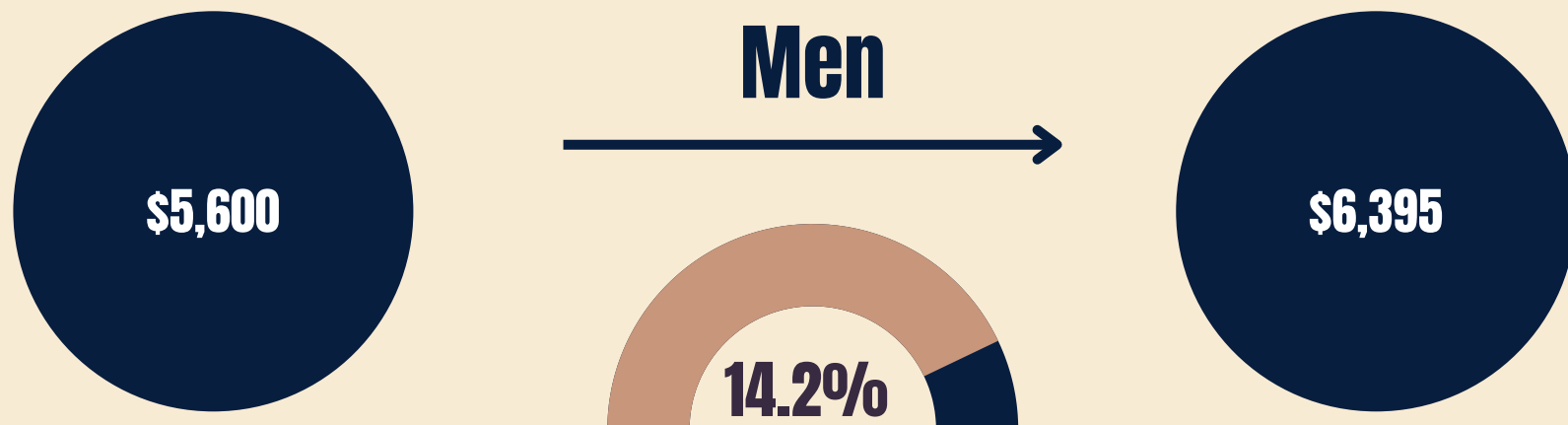
MIAMI-DADE

The employment count in 2019 compared to 2021 in Miami-Dade has decreased across most groups and like Broward, the age groups of 14-18 and 65-99 have had an increase in labor participation.

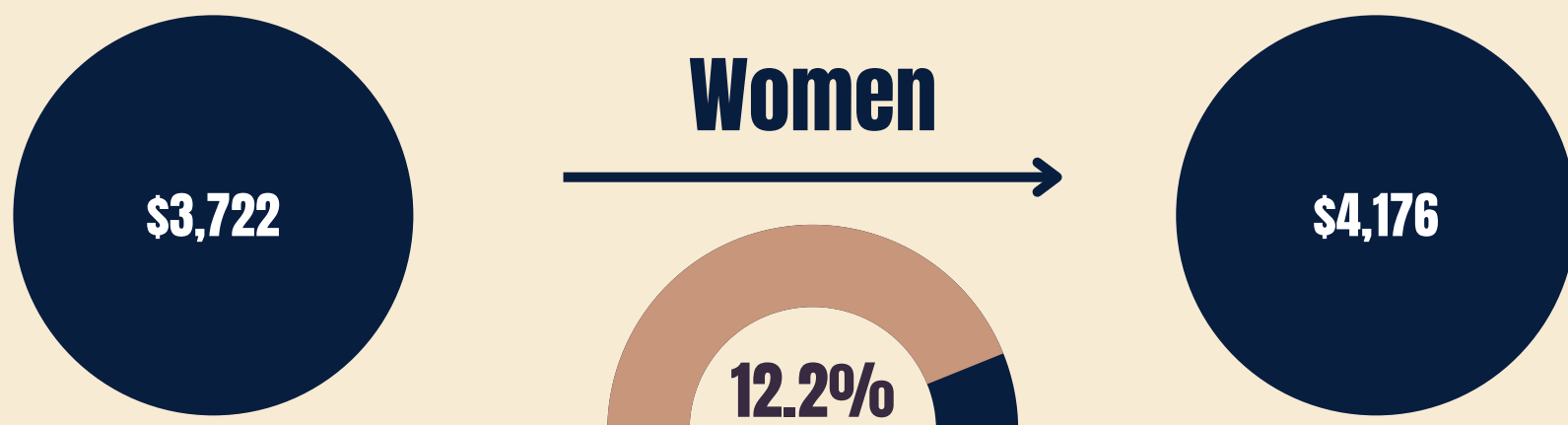


Employment count for Blacks or African Americans in Miami-Dade County **decreased** by 9.6%, in late 2019 compared to early 2021.

For men in Broward there has been a 14.2% **increase** in average monthly wages in early 2021 compared to late 2019.

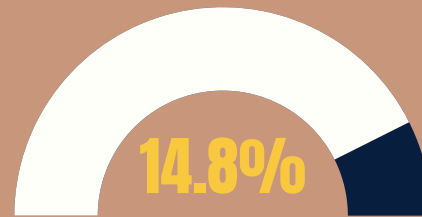


For women in Broward there has been a 12.2% **increase** in average monthly wages in early 2021 compared to late 2019.

Miami-Dade County's Average Nominal Monthly Wages



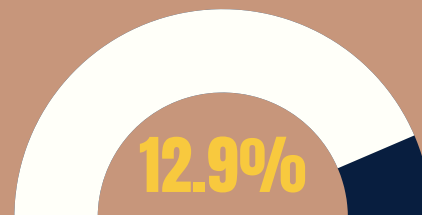

For men in Miami-Dade, there has been a 14.8% **increase** in average monthly wages in early 2021 compared to late 2019.

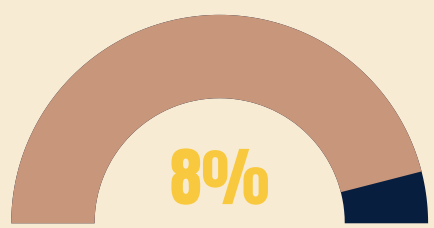
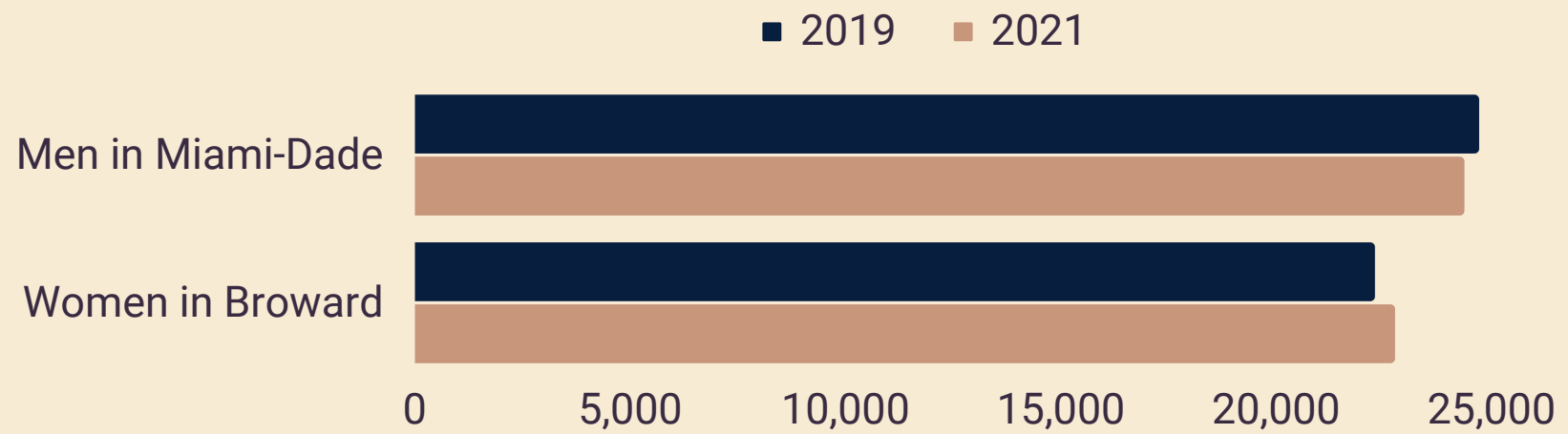
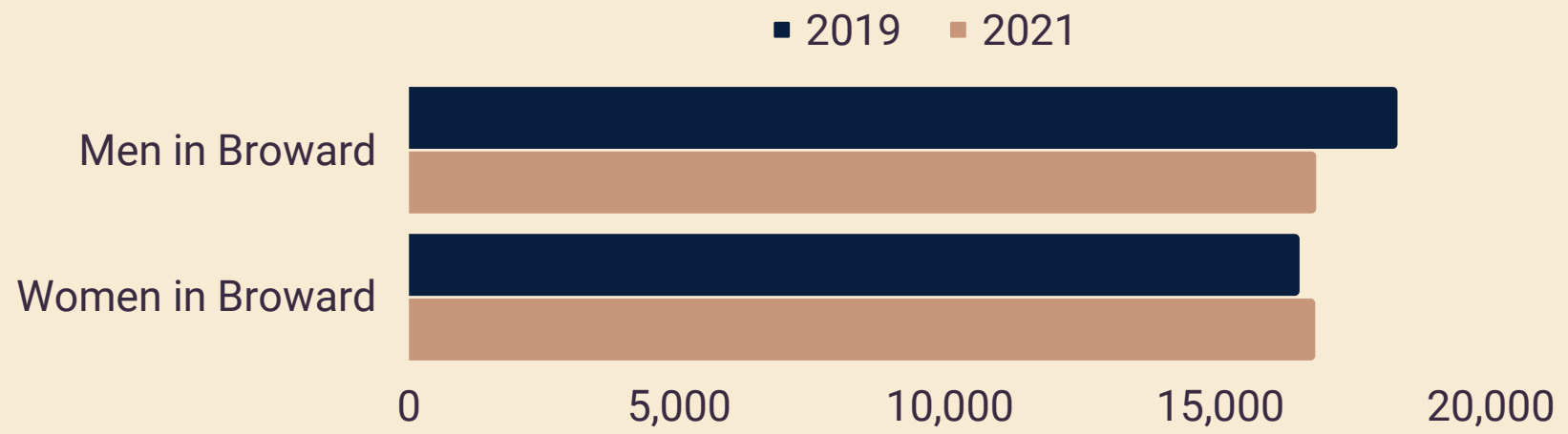

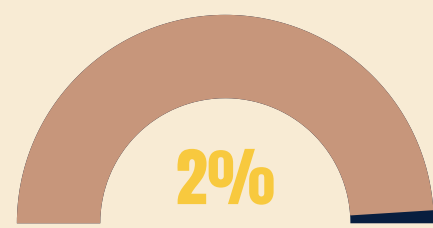


For women in Miami-Dade, there has been a 12.9% **increase** in average monthly wages in early 2021 compared to late 2019.

Job Losses in Broward and Miami-Dade



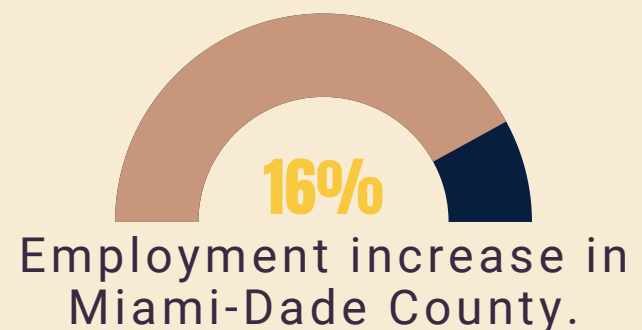
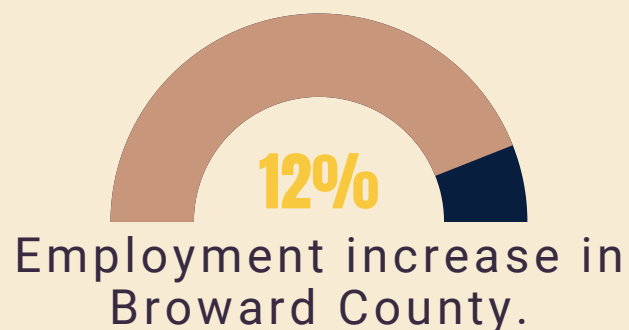
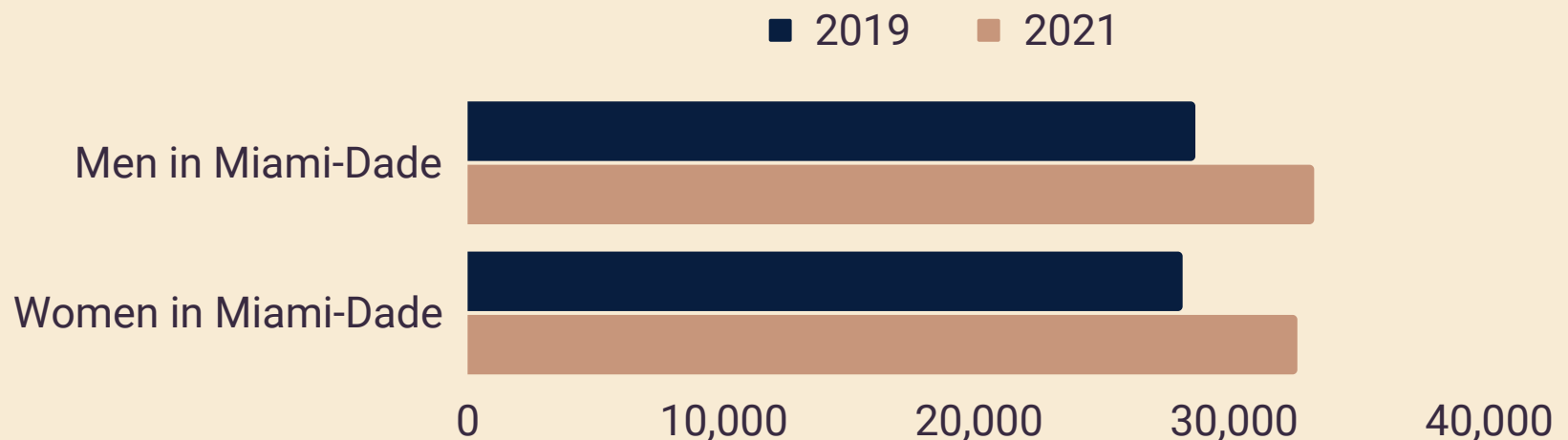
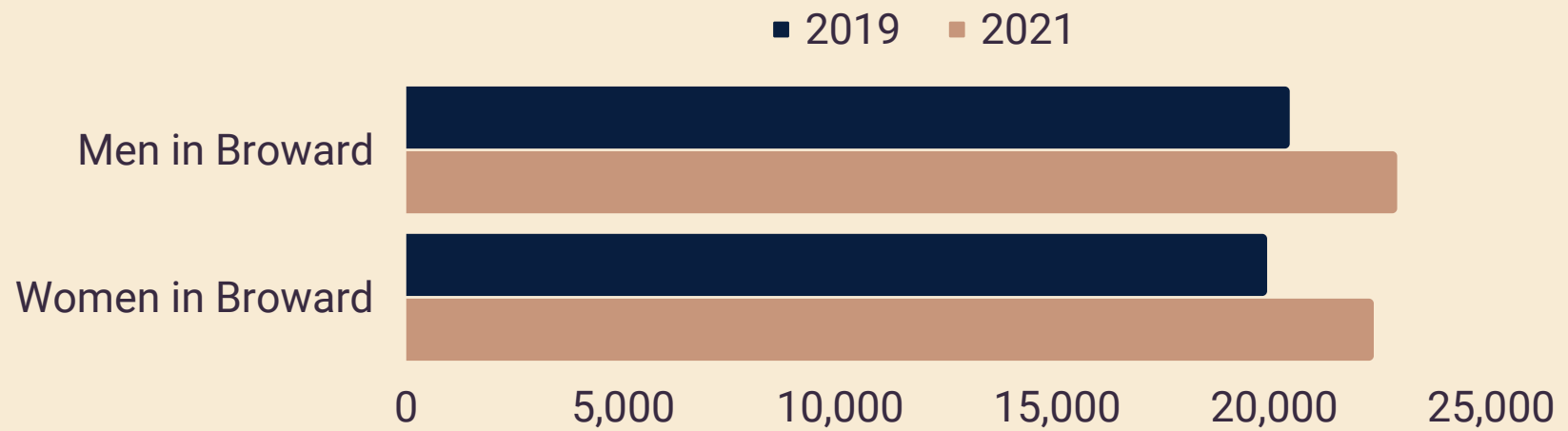
There was an **8% decrease** in job losses for men in Broward and a 1% decrease for men in Miami-Dade.
