

Hurricane Preparedness during the COVID-19 Pandemic

June 2020

As the effects of COVID-19 continue, Floridians will likely face significant impacts in their ability to prepare for this hurricane season. This unprecedented pandemic was cited by respondents as causing negative impacts on their overall household preparedness, disruptions to their hurricane planning, and instilling a reluctance to evacuate in the wake of a hurricane threat.

Respondent Overview

- 800 Coastal Households Surveyed

- 93% English Speakers

- 7% Spanish Speakers

- 52.8% Females

- 47.3% Males

- 77.6% Live in Single-Detached Homes


- 17.5% Live in Apartment, Condominium, or Townhome

- 3.9% Live in Manufactured or Mobile Homes

- 84.4% Owners

- 15.5% Renters

- 90.5% Permanent Resident of FL for 10+ Years



When would you evacuate?

If a hurricane watch is issued (48 hours before a storm)	10.8 %
If a hurricane warning is issued (36 hours before a storm)	6.8 %

If emergency management officials ordered you to evacuate	28.7 %
