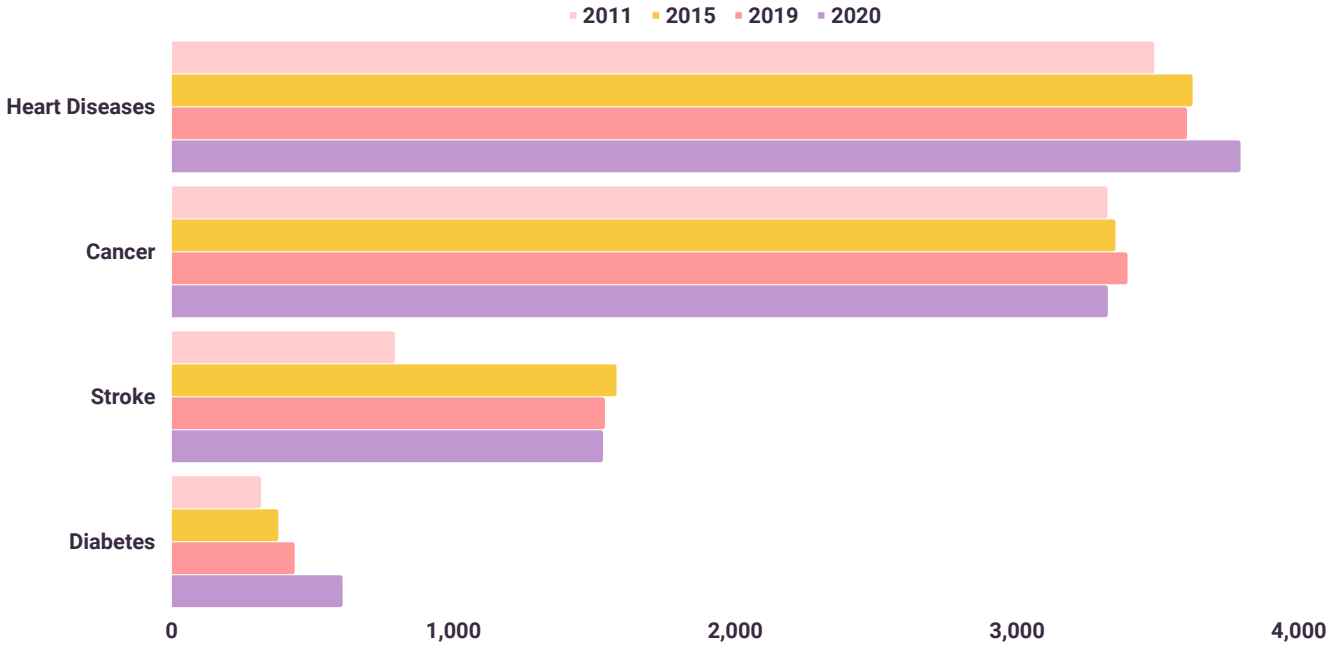

Equitable health care means the all individuals have access to affordable, high quality, culturally and linguistically appropriate care in a timely manner.

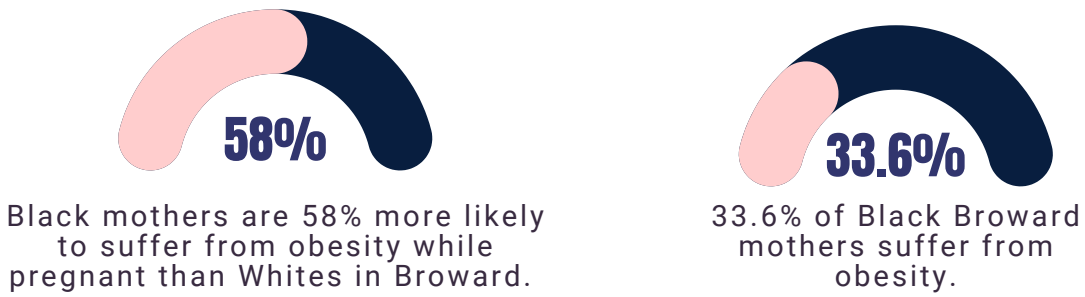
### Leading causes of death in Broward County:



## MATERNAL HEALTH

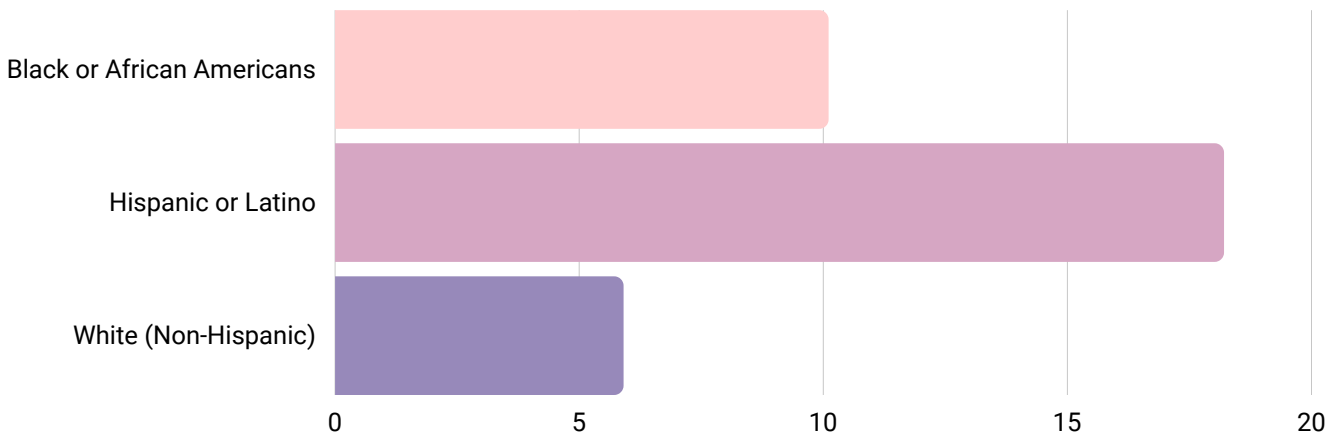
Prenatal care and maternal health is the largest predictor of infant health at birth.

Percent of uninsured individuals in Broward County.

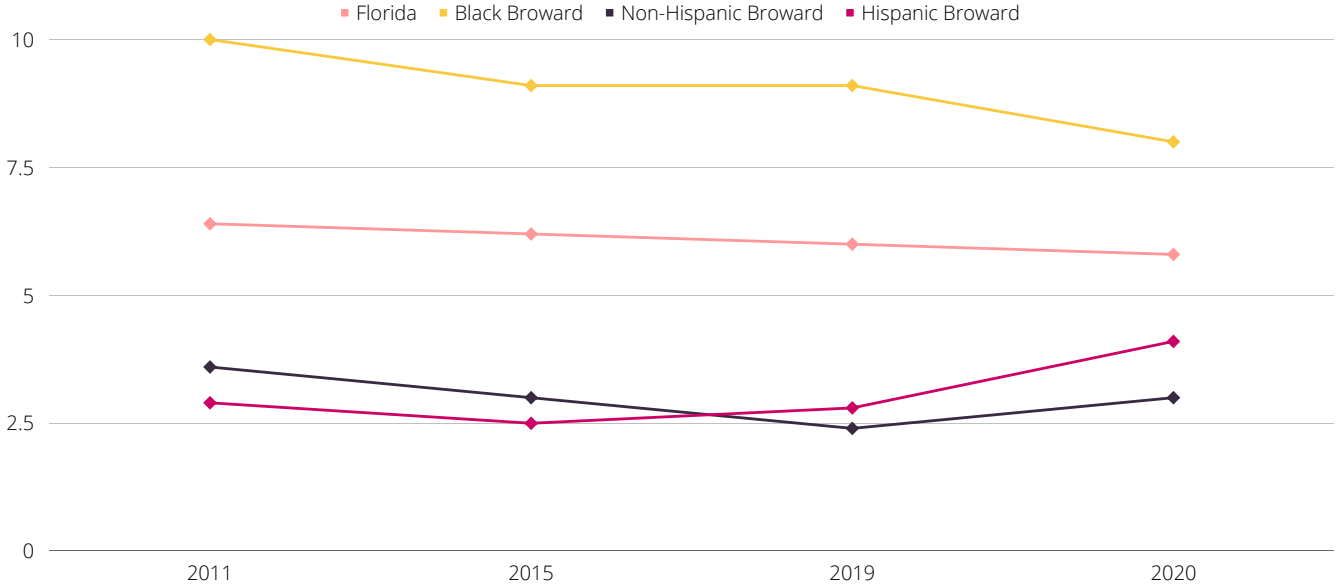


A lack of affordable, accessible, and equitable health care and prenatal services has played a significant part in the rates of infant deaths, maternal health risks and preterm births.

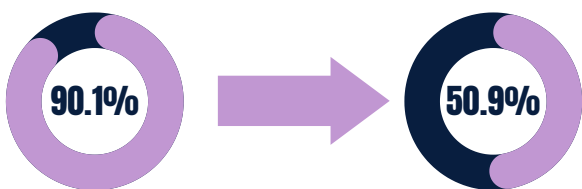
- Broward mothers are more likely to only seek prenatal care in their third trimester than the rate of all of Florida.

### Infant Mortality in Broward County:

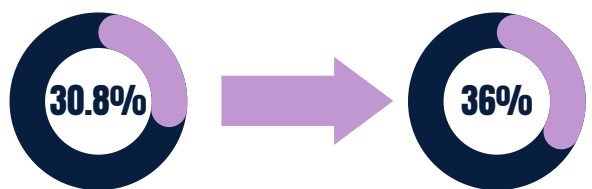
Infant mortality is the death of a live-born baby during the first year of life. The rate is the number of infant deaths per 1,000 live births.



## HIV CASES IN BROWARD COUNTY



The HIV diagnosis rate among Blacks and African Americans in Broward County has decreased from 90.1% per 100,000 in 2010 to 50.9% in 2019.



The HIV diagnosis rate among Hispanics in Broward County has increased from 30.8% per 100,000 in 2010 to 36% in 2019.
