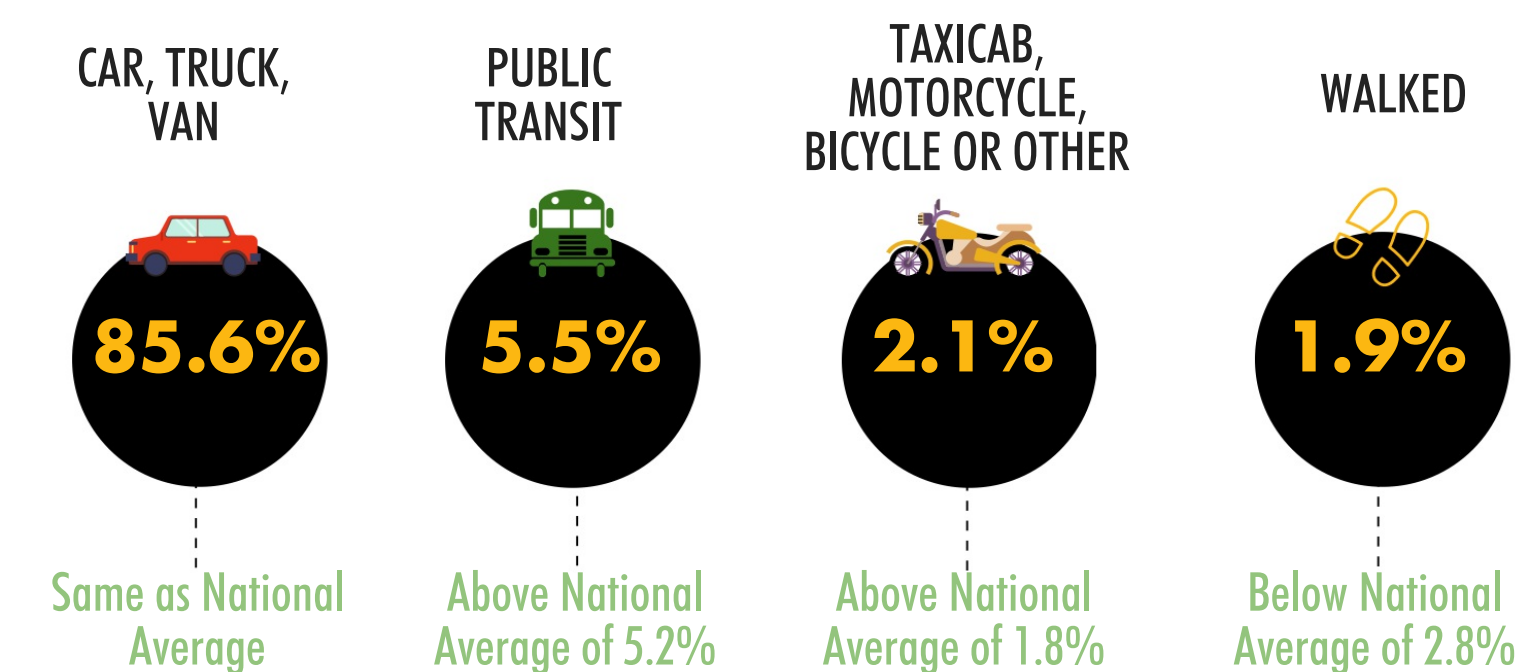

US COUNTIES WITH OVER 1 MIL. COMMUTERS

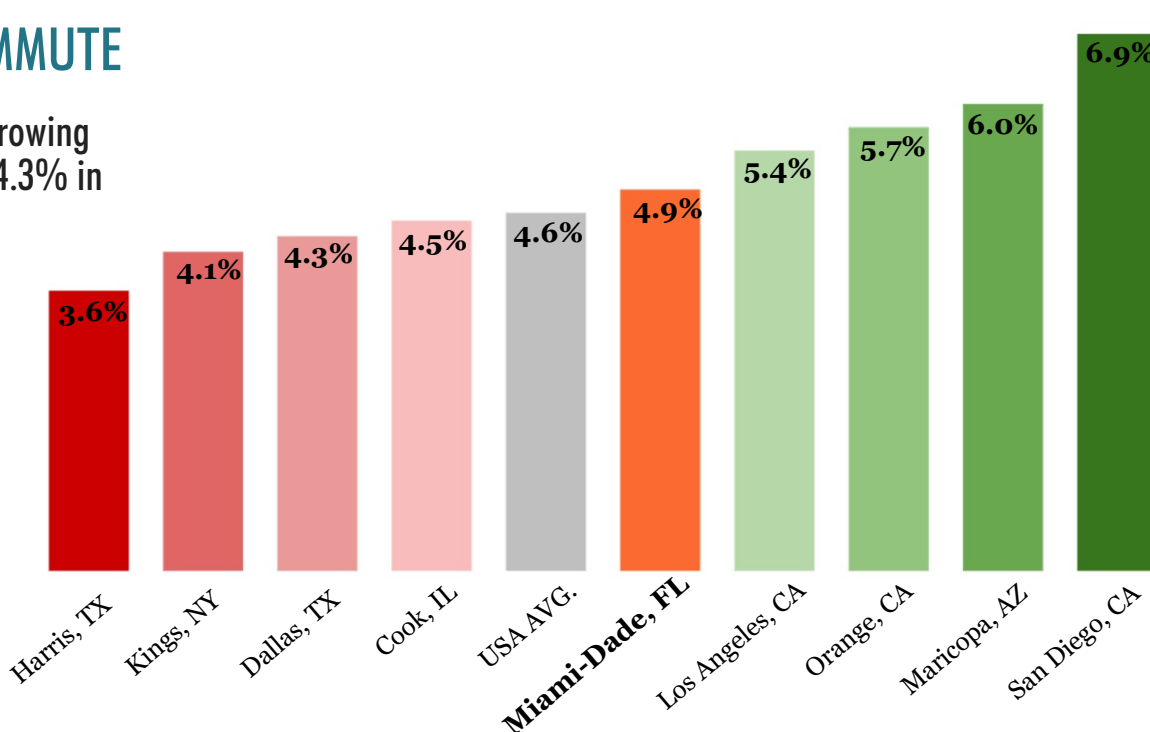
Highest Public Transit Usage: Kings County, NY (62.0%) & Cooks County, IL (18.8%)

Highest Automobile Usage: Harris County, TX (90.2%) & Dallas County, TX (89.2%)

SKIPPING THE COMMUTE

Working from home is a growing trend nationally, up from 4.3% in 2010 to 4.6% in 2015

The percentage of Miamians working from home has risen from 4.2% to 4.9% between 2010-2015

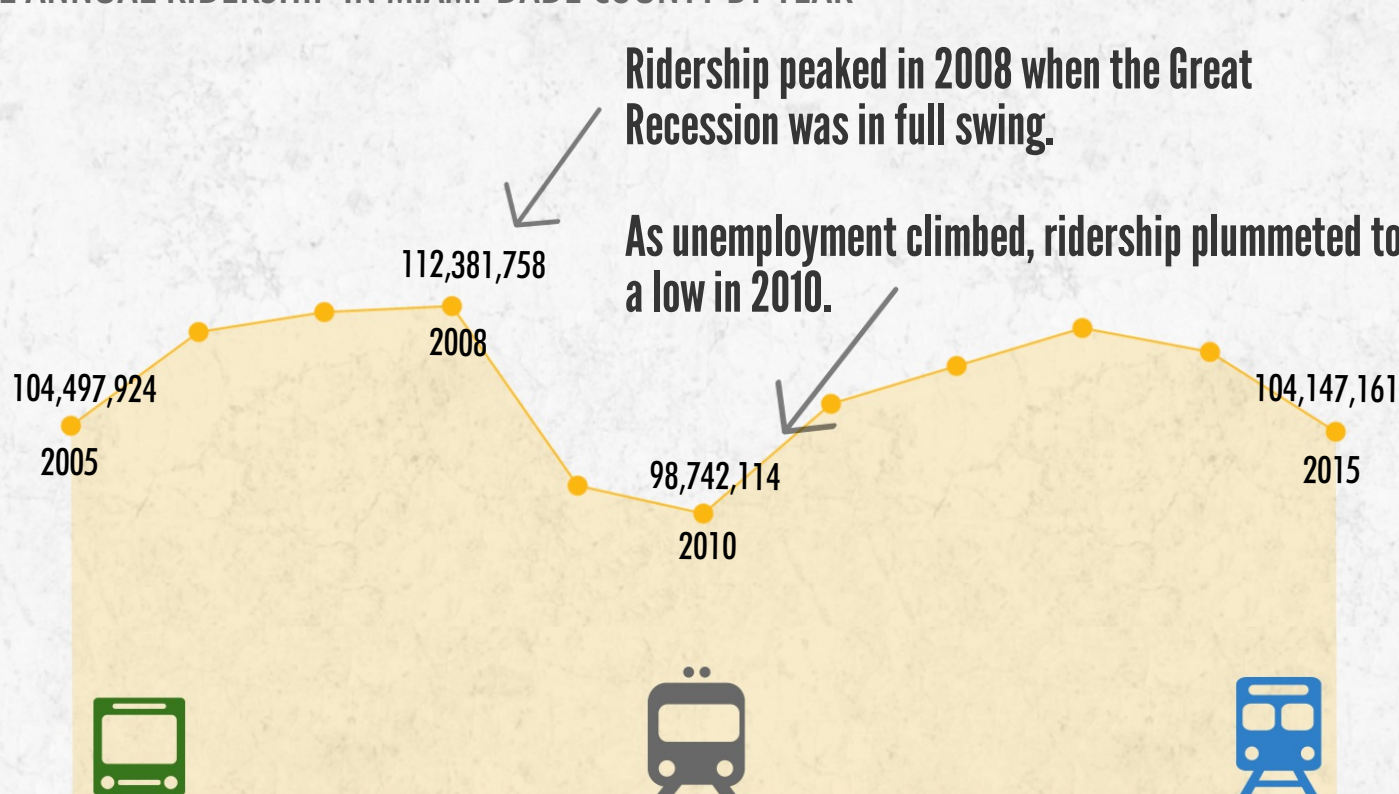
Average travel time to work in Miami-Dade: 30.4 minutes

PUBLIC TRANSIT RIDERSHIP RATES

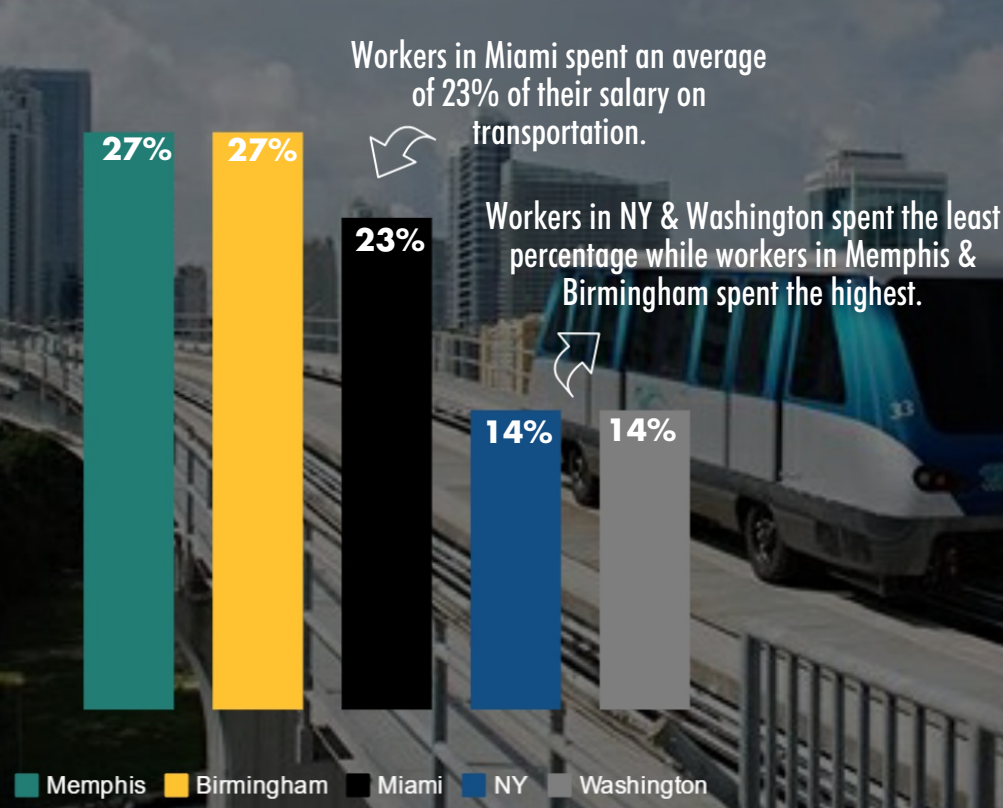


TOTAL ANNUAL RIDERSHIP IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY BY YEAR

FREE TRANSIT SERVICES EXPANDING

Since launching in March 2012 in the City of Miami, trolleys have had high monthly ridership and have plans to continue growing. In 2015, there were 8 million trolley rides in Miami-Dade County across 27 municipalities.

SMART PLAN

In April 2016, the Miami-Dade MPO developed the SMART Plan to address traffic congestion and provide alternative transit choices throughout the County. The plan includes the development of 6 rapid transit corridors as well as Express buses to connect to existing Metrorail system.
