## Speaker Biographies

The Honorable Carlos Curbelo, Florida's 26<sup>th</sup> Congressional District was first elected in November of 2014. At 34, Curbelo is one of the youngest Members of the US House of Representatives. Carlos currently serves on the Transportation and Infrastructure, Education and Workforce and Small Business Committee. A Miami native, Carlos attended Belen Jesuit Preparatory School and the University of Miami earning a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration and a Master's Degree in Public Administration in 2002. In 2002, just months out of college, Carlos founded a public and media relations firm that did work for South Florida and international companies. As a small business executive he met the challenges of meeting payroll, balancing budgets, and building teams with success. In 2009, he was named State Director for US Senator George LeMieux and was responsible for overseeing staff in seven offices throughout the state and advising the Senator on Latin American policy and Hispanic issues. In 2010, he was appointed by Florida's Governor to the Miami-Dade Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), a federally mandated board tasked with prioritizing local transportation and infrastructure projects. Carlos is also the cofounder of Centre Court Charities, a non-profit organization that runs basketball leagues for high school students during the summer months. In November of 2010, Carlos was elected to serve on the Miami Dade County School Board the nation's fourth largest school district. Shortly after being elected, he was the only School Board Member in the state asked to serve on the Governor's Education Transition Team where he as a champion for reform, school choice, and equity in funding.

Dr. Michael K Evans is Chairman of Evans, Carroll & Associates, Inc. An Economic consulting firm specializing in EB-5 immigration analysis, economic impact studies of development projects and new construction, models of state and local tax receipts, impact of current and proposed government legislation, and construction of econometric models for individual industries and companies. He has prepared over 500 economic impact reports relating to variety of EB5 projects including hotels, housing complexes, mixed use commercial, projects, schools, mines, etc. Mr. Evans is skilled in utilizing the regional input/output models RIMS II and IMPLAN to determine the output/employment multipliers for the EB-5 project in question. Each report takes into account variables such as similar nearby businesses, economic conditions in the area, multi-dimensional projects, and more. A standard economic report produced by the team at Evans, Carroll & Associates can include data such as a determination of the increase in employment, output, and labor income for the 20 major industrial classifications in the RIMS II model, determination of the same variables for construction expenditures, analysis of whether the project is located in a TEA, economic statistics and analysis of all the counties in the relevant county group, commuting patterns, and more.

In addition to numerous engagements as a university law professor, Michael also actively participates in public speaking engagements, both in the EB-5, business financing/crowdfunding, and business law arenas, and as an inspirational speaker to teenage and young adult cancer survivors (as one himself) on finding post-treatment life success. Michael earned his J.D. from the University of Southern California, and his B.A. from the University of California, Los Angeles. He is a member of the State Bar of California, the American Immigration Lawyers Association, and the IIUSA (the Association to Invest in the USA, the EB-5 industry trade organization).

Maria Ilcheva, Ph.D. (Expertise: Economic Impact Studies) has been employed as a senior researcher at the Metropolitan Center since 2009. She has experience and responsibility in a number of areas critical to the Metropolitan Center's operations, including serving as Principal Investigator and/or Project Manager on a number of contracts and grants, with many of them including a public involvement element. Dr. Ilcheva has over eight years of experience in working on various economic development, social and behavioral projects. Ms. Ilcheva serves as Subject Matter Expert in behavioral research, including surveys, polling, evaluations, and focus groups and supervises and maintains quality standards for SPSS statistical analysis for Center projects.
