System (MTS) and vessels in the possible path of an approaching hurricane or severe storm are prepared at least twelve hours prior to its arrival to minimize negative impacts









- Execute post storm response operations in support of the public:

Seasonal Average








USCG Preparedness Definition

Tropical Storm Force Winds - 39-54 MPH

Readiness Conditions are based upon the approach of <u>SUSTAINED</u> Tropical Storm Force Winds associated with Tropical Cyclone activity (Depressions, Storms Hurricanes)






Coast Guard Sector Miami:

HURRTRAK RM/Pro 2008: Hurricane IKE - 09/05/2008-05:00 EDT Maximum Sustained Winds: 110 KNOTS / Category 3 Forward Motion: 14 knots towards the West



| Condition | Set by COTP | Port Status |

| Whiskey | Sustained Tropical Storm force winds are forecast within 72 hrs. | Facilities begin removing all debris and secure flying hazards |
| "Watch Condition" | | |
| | COTP will commence the teleconference cycle with the <u>Severe Weather</u> Advisory Team (SWAT) | Implement container stacking plans; if unable to lower to 4 high must seek approval from COTP |

| Condition | Set by COTP | Port Status |
|-------------------|--|--|
| X-Ray | Sustained Tropical Storm force winds are forecast within 48 hrs. | Facilities secure hazmat and potential pollution sources |
| "Watch Condition" | | |
| | COTP will deploy liaisons to County EOCs to coordinate bridge lock- downs | Vessels >500GT prepare to depart port by Yankee or submit mooring plans to COTP by Yankee |
| | | Facilities lower container stacks to 4 high |
| | | Prepare to terminate cargo operations |

| Condition | Set by COTP | Port Status |
|---------------------|--|--|
| YANKEE | Sustained Tropical Storm force winds are forecast within <u>24 hrs</u> . | Port closed to inbound traffic |
| "Warning Condition" | Note: some bridges may be locked down if experiencing high gusts of wind | Vessels >500GT must depart port/anchorage unless COTP approved Terminate facility operations not associated with storm preparations |

| Condition | Set by COTP | Port Status |
|--------------------------------|--|---|
| ZULU "Danger Condition" | Sustained Gale force winds are forecast within <u>12 hrs</u> . | All vessels >500GT must have departed port/anchorage unless COTP approved |
| | Most if not all bridges should be expected to be locked-down | Port is closed to waterfront activities |
| | | All facility operations must cease unless specifically approved by COTP |

| Condition | Set by COTP | Port Status |
|--|---|---|
| "Assess, Reconstitute, and Recovery Phase" | Storm has passed, Winds less than Tropical Storm Force | Affected Ports - No vessel movement until ATON and channel surveys are conducted |
| | Reopen shipping channel(s) and ports when weather conditions permit | Facilities conduct damage assessment – reconstitute Facility Security Plans – no |
| | Port Teams assess ATON, Facility and waterway status | commercial activity until Security Plans are recovered |
| | Coordinate bridge re- opening with County EOCs | No waterside activity unless approved by COTP |
