MIAMI-DADE POPULATION

Following the trend of a declining population, Miami-Dade County's employed population declined between 2019 and 2021.

TOTAL POPULATION

2,716,940 → 2,662,777

POPULATION 16 YEARS AND OVER

2,230,221 → 2,191,172

POPULATION 16 YEARS AND OVER IN THE LABOR FORCE

1,417,882 → 1,385,234

EMPLOYED CIVILIAN POPULATION 16 AND OVER

1,366,451 → 1,297,349


LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION

IN 2021, MIAMI-DADE COUNTY HAD A 63.2% LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATE AND A 6.1% UNEMPLOYMENT RATE.

THE MDC LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATE MINIMALLY DECREASED BETWEEN 2019-2021; HOWEVER, UNEMPLOYMENT ROSE FROM 5.3%.

2021 COUNTY, STATE, NATION COMPARISON


■ Labor Force Participation Rate ■ Unemployment Rate



WORKING FROM HOME

Prior to the COVID-19 Pandemic in 2019, only 5.5% of the working population in Miami-Dade County worked from home (75,504 people).

MEANS OF COMMUTING IN 2021



That rate in 2021 is more than double compared to 2019.

15.1% of the working population or 193,449 people worked from home in 2021. Women (15.8%) were also more likely to work from home compared to men (14.6%).

However, the rate of those working from home in Miami-Dade County is lower than the state (16.6%) and national (17.9%) rates.

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

THE RATE OF THOSE COMMUTING TO WORK USING PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY ONLY FELL 1.1 PERCENT POINT.

PERCENT OF THE COMMUTING POPULATION USING PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION 2019 VS. 2021

MIAMI-DADE COUNTY

3.8% → 2.7%

FLORIDA

1.6% → 1%

UNITED STATES

5% → 2.5%

HOWEVER, AT THE NATIONAL LEVEL, PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION COMMUTING FELL BY ABOUT HALF. THE LOWEST PERCENTAGE OF WORKERS COMMUTING BY PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION THAT HAS EVER BEEN RECORDED BY THE ACS
