
NATION'S POPULATION

PENNSYLVANIA'S ESTIMATED POPULATION WAS 302,000 — A YEAR BEFORE THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE WAS SIGNED IN PHILADELPHIA.



2024

PENNSYLVANIA'S POPULATION REACHED 13.1 MILLION, OVER 43 TIMES LARGER THAN IN 1775.




DURING THIS TIME, THE U.S. POPULATION WAS ESTIMATED AT 2.8 MILLION.





2025

THE U.S. POPULATION IS NOW 342 MILLION, NEARLY 123 TIMES MORE THAN IN 1780.




PATRIOTIC PLACE NAMES

INCORPORATED U.S. PLACES HAD PATRIOTIC NAMES AS OF JULY 2024.






"LIBERTY" (MOST COMMON)
