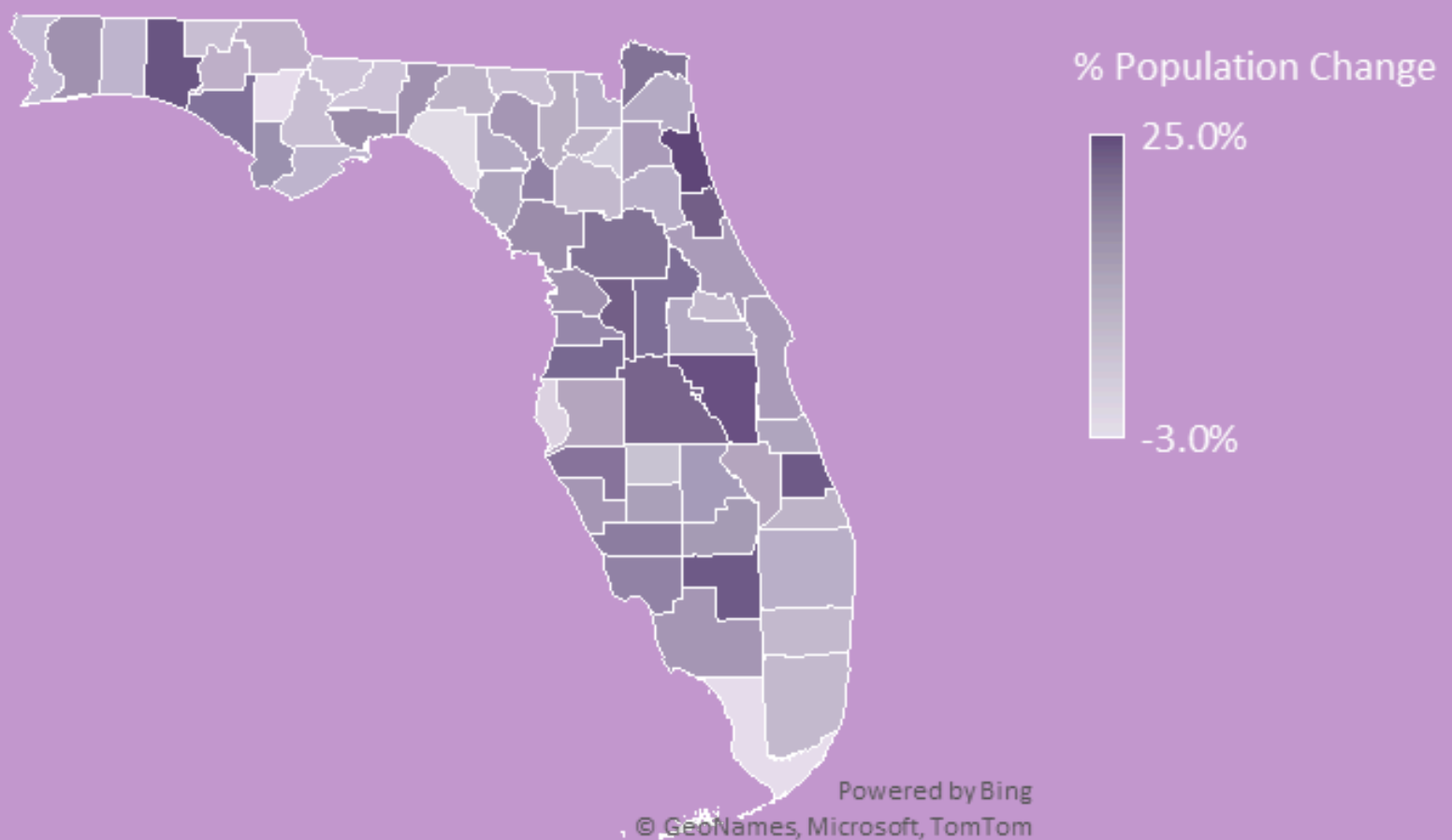


Population Trends in Florida 2020-2025

For counties with at least 1 million population in 2025, the top ten counties by population growth were in the following states:



in Florida: **Duval, Hillsborough, and Orange counties.** They had a growth rate of **6.5%, 7.4%, and 6.7% respectively.**



in North Carolina: **Mecklenburg and Wake counties.** They had a growth rate of **10.5% and 11.2% respectively.**



in Texas: **Bexar, Collin, Denton, Harris, and Travis counties.** The growth rate varied from **6.6% in Harris County to 20.6% in Collin County.**

For counties with at least 1 million population in 2025, the top ten counties by population decline were in the following states:



in California: **Alameda and Los Angeles counties.** Both had a growth rate of **-2.6% and -3% respectively.**



in New York: **Bronx Kings, and New York counties,** with rates of **-3.8%, -2.5%, and -1.3% respectively.**



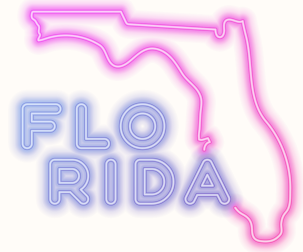
in Pennsylvania: **Philadelphia and Allegheny counties,** with rates of **-1.7% and -2% respectively.**

1 county was in each of the following states: Michigan, Ohio, and Illinois.

The counties with the largest percentage growth were outside of South Florida:

For the non-South Florida counties with a population of over a million in 2025, from April 01, 2020 to July 01, 2025,

- Hillsborough and Duval counties experienced a **positive population growth** fueled by natural changes (births minus deaths) and net domestic (domestic in-migration minus out migration) and net international migration (international in-migration minus out migration).
- Orange County experienced a **negative net domestic migration** of 55,810.

Population Trends in South Florida: July 1, 2020-July 1, 2025

Broward, Miami-Dade, and Palm Beach counties' population growth surpassed the 3.1% increase of the country.

Monroe county experienced a **decrease in population**.

From April 01, 2020, to July 01, 2025, the population changes in South Florida were characterized by:

- **Positive natural change** (births - deaths), high levels of international migration, and a negative domestic migration in Broward and Miami-Dade.
- Miami-Dade had a **negative net domestic migration of -278,091**.
- Monroe County experienced a **population decrease due to negative natural change** (a larger number of deaths than births) and a negative domestic net migration.
- Palm Beach's **negative natural change** was offset by its positive net domestic and net international migration.
