

The Retail Trade sector has the highest total number of establishments of any industry in South Florida except Health Care. Miami-Dade has the largest number of retail establishments in South Florida.




Employees


Employers by Size

76% of retail establishments in Miami-Dade County have fewer than 10 employees, and 97% have fewer than 100.




Wages
