# **MIAMI-DADE POPULATION**

Following the trend of a declining population, Miami-Dade County's employed population declined between 2019 and 2021.



# LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION

IN 2021, MIAMI-DADE COUNTY HAD A 63.2% LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATE AND A 6.1% UNEMPLOYMENT RATE.

THE MDC LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATE MINIMALLY DECREASED BETWEEN 2019–2021; HOWEVER, UNEMPLOYMENT ROSE FROM 5.3%.

#### 2021 COUNTY, STATE, NATION COMPARISON




# **WORKING FROM HOME**

Prior to the COVID-19 Pandemic in 2019, only 5.5% of the working population in Miami-Dade County worked from home (75,504 people).

# MEANS OF COMMUTING IN 2021

68.9%



That rate in 2021 is more than double compared to 2019.

15.1% of the working population or 193,449 people worked from home in 2021. Women (15.8%) were also more likely to work from home compared to men (14.6%).

However, the rate of those working from home in Miami-Dade County is lower than the state (16.6%) and national (17.9%) rates.

# **PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION**

THE RATE OF THOSE COMMUTING TO WORK USING PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY ONLY FELL 1.1 PERCENT POINT.
