
24.4% of South Florida's population is Black – over 1.2 million people.

I. Population

Broward County has the largest number of Black residents in South Florida – nearly 550,000 residents.




Household income difference between white and Black households, Miami-Dade

Across South Florida, the Black poverty rate is between 2.7% and 9.3% higher than the Hispanic/Latino poverty rate.




White alone Black Hispanic or Latino


Black residents of both sexes in Miami-Dade have similar median annual incomes, though they make less than both white residents and Hispanic or Latino residents.

Miami-Dade has the largest gap between white and Black high school graduation rates in South Florida – a 12.3% difference. It also has the lowest Black graduation rate (79.5%) in the tri-county area.




White Hispanic or Latino Black

In Florida, 1 in 6,750 Black residents have died from COVID-19. In comparison, 1 in 10,000 white residents have died from COVID-19.


Deaths per 100,000 people (Florida)

In the 2015 National Survey on Drug Use and Health, about 17 million whites and 4 million African Americans reported having used an illicit drug within the last month.

African Americans and whites use drugs at similar rates, but the imprisonment rate of African Americans for drug charges is almost 6 times that of whites.

African Americans represent 12.5% of illicit drug users, but 29% of those arrested for drug offenses and 33% of those incarcerated in state facilities for drug offenses.

While about 18% of Miami-Dade's population is Black they represented over 42% of all adult arrests in the county in 2018.

There is a disproportionate arrest rate of juvenile Black residents in Miami-Dade. 16 in 100 Black residents aged 15-17 were arrested in 2018, but only 4 in 100 Hispanic/Latino residents and 2 in 100 white residents were arrested.
