

CRIMINAL JUSTICE AND SAFETY

According to the 2019-2020 crime data report released by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, Broward County's overall crime rate decreased 13.5% in the past year.


Despite the decrease, minorities are still severely disproportionately affected by the criminal justice system.

Broward County Crime Activity by Type:




Juvenile arrests were down 61 percent in Broward County from 2015 due in a large part to the COVID-19 pandemic. Juvenile intake arrests were down 54 percent statewide from 2015 to 2020.

However, the rates of juvenile arrests in Broward County by race show a significant disparity between White and Black.



Blacks & Latinos together comprise 30% of the general population, but 58% of the prison population
